**PUBLIC FORUM**

## 8. POLICE MATTERS :

i) New Police matters : Two shed burglaries on High Street. Lead removed from the school roof. Drug abuse in the school grounds with damage to school furniture. Illegal and inconsiderate parking is no longer a Police concern, the monitoring and control of this problem is now with N.L.C. It was noted that the new traffic wardens employed to undertake this role by N.L.C will predominantly be deployed in Scunthorpe, Barton and Brigg. Clerk to enquire when traffic wardens will visit rural areas.

It was noted that PC Lee Fuller will now undertake duties in Barton and will be replaced with a WPC.

Cllr Mrs Havercroft noted that expensive booklets were distributed to victims of crime but perhaps the money would be better spent on more Police Officers patrolling the streets.

## 9. NORTH LINCOLNSHIRE COUNCIL MATTERS :

i) Annexe A - listing the outstanding matters from N.L.C - previously circulated. No progress made. Cllr Clark suggested that Rod Chapman of N.L.C be asked to look into the flooding and associated road maintenance problem on Thornton lane, near sewerage lane as the repair work in this area is inadequate.

ii) New matters :

Salt bins have been applied for. It was noted that this matter was raised at the NATS meeting by Cllr's Cox and Balderston with Pete Scott present who indicated that salt bins would be beneficial at the top and bottom of Skitter Hill. The road at the school end of Hallcroft is in a poor state of repair and needs urgent attention. Cllr Clark indicated that it might be the responsibility of North Lincolnshire Homes.

It was noted that litter is becoming an increasing problem in Ulceby. It was suggested that the school be approached to undertake an assembly on 'Keep Ulceby Tidy'. Cllr Balderston may take this up with the Headmaster at the primary school.

The litter bin outside Earl Close has not been replaced by Keigar Homes.
